It grows exclusively in the Americas, and is one of the most popular woods in yacht building because of its warm, elegant colour and infinite shades, and this colour is often named Mahogany. The Mahogany colour is a red that is "dirtied" with black and blue, transforming it into a dark Bordeaux, vaguely scarlet or ruby with

hints of plum and violet purple. Like a fine, well-structured red wine, this lovely rainbow of colours is deep, dark and intense.
